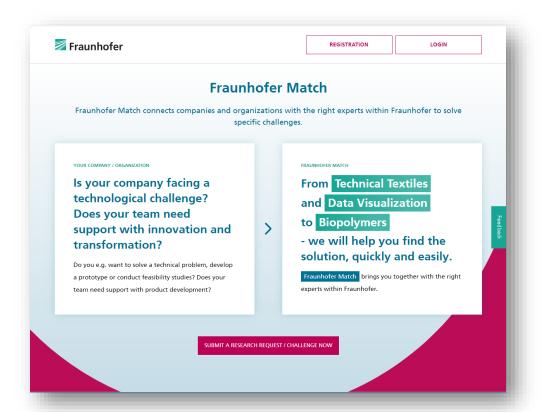


Customer interaction - Fraunhofer Match

Consortium projects Transfer format at a glance



Initiation of multilateral industry projects on industry-relevant research topics













Identifying **specific needs** in discussions with industry representatives at various events (e.g. trade fairs, regulars' tables, conferences, publications)

- Development of project ideas that are advertised in project inserts
- Conducting acquisition talks to gain partners (adapting the project idea if necessary)

Multilateral industrial project consortium (usually pre-competitive)

Added value for Fraunhofer:

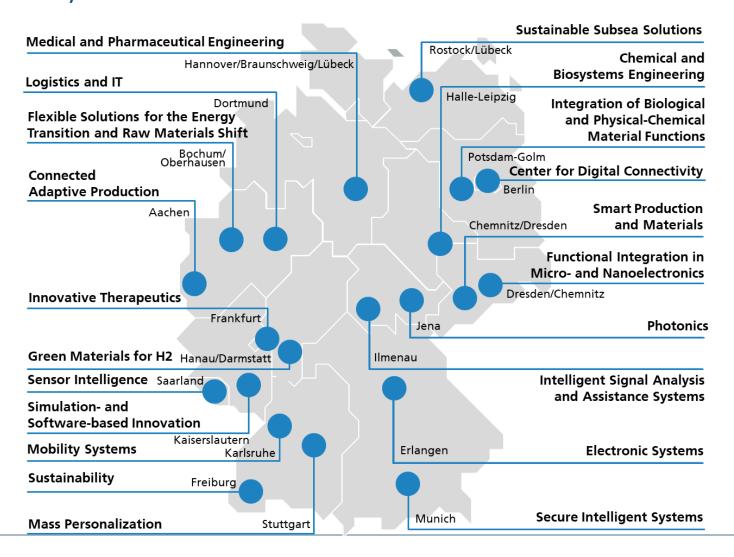
- through low-threshold financial contributions, many companies with similar issues, especially SMEs, are involved
- entering into partnerships for further (also publicly funded) collaborative projects with participants from the consortia

Added value for the customer:

- project is realized cost-efficiently, as the expenses for the project are shared with other companies

- opportunity to develop or deepen new contacts



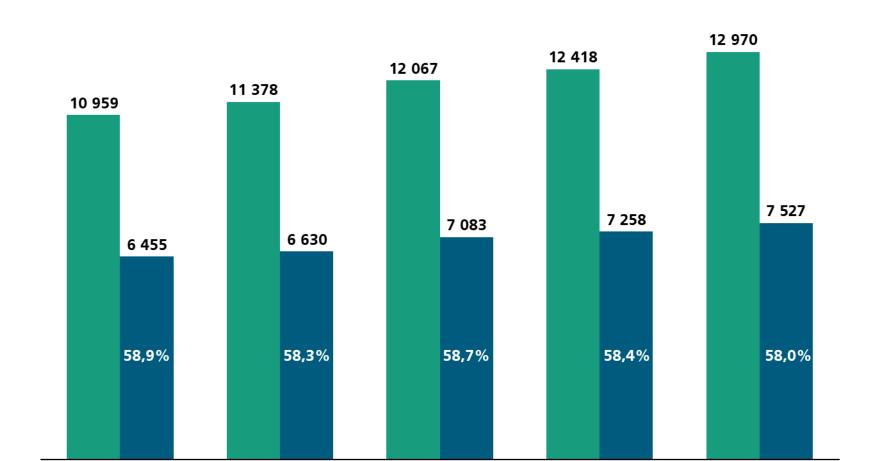
